Public Information Officer (PIO)- the Public Information Officer should coordinate all disseminate, the approval of the Chief, all information regarding the Line-Of-Duty Death. The release of name of injured or deceased firefighters should never be done prior to the notification of the next of kin. The PIO's responsibilities may include:

- 1. Coordinate and/or presentation of all media contracts including interviews, news conference and written news releases.
- 2. Coordinate the notification of:
 - a. Local Public Officials
 - b. Local Union
 - c. Surrounding Fire Departments
 - d. Public Safety Officers Benefit Program (888-744-6513)
 - e. National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (301-447-1365)
 - f. State Fire Marshal (888-243-0305)
 - g. State and Federal elected Officials
 - h. Other related State and Local organizations
- 3. Establish information telephone numbers- recorded or live
- 4. Prepare press kits-bio(s) pictures, service info, maps, etc.
- 5. Organize media coverage. Use medial pool coverage to limit and manage media areas at service and burial.
- 6. Prepare printed service programs for viewing and burial.
- 7. Manage VIP arrangements.
- 8. Update our web page.
